Phonics Reception

The children have completed Phase 2 and will continue to benefit from reinforcing all the sounds they have previously learned so please continue to go over these. It is important that your child also knows the letters by their names (refer back to the alphabet song) You will find a detailed outline of all the sounds in Phase 2 on our school website in Class 1’s page – ‘Phonics – A Guide For Parents.’

This Week - Phase 3 sounds to learn are: **j and v**

Go to the Class Google Site where you will find Espresso (log in: student9562 password: ca5tle) Then go to Phonics and use Scrap’s Phonics (Phase 2/3) videos.

- After watching the video clips of the **j and v** sounds use the activities on blending, reading, segmenting and spelling to the right of the screen.
- Use PhonicsPlay (access this via our Class Google Site) Play ‘Buried Treasure’ using Phase 3 sounds - **j and v**
- Practise writing the letter sounds. You could write in the frost as it is so icy outside!
- Can you sound out and write these CVC words – **jet, van, vet, jog, jam**
- Use the CVC word activity booklet in the

Literacy: Writing (You can use the Activity Sheet in the Parent Resource Folder)

- Talk about your Christmas holiday ‘news’ and write a simple sentence to describe something you have done. Draw a picture about it too.
- ‘Write’ a list of all the favourite things you have experienced over the Christmas break – it could be favourite gifts and toys received or favourite foods eaten.
- Continue to practise writing your own name and then your surname if you can! Use paints and brushes to write it too.

Speaking and Listening: Talk about a favourite book or story to your family using your own words. Can you remember some of the main events and characters in the story? Act it out in role play and get your family to join in.

Use some of your toys at home to retell the story. You could make some story props too!

Reception Maths

Use White Rose Maths Home Learning for Early Years. Access this via our Class Google Site. Use ‘**Alive in 5! Week 1**’ to use the daily activities. There are 5 sessions (1 for each day) with a teaching video and an activity to complete each day.

- **Other Number Tasks:** Can you count in 10’s up to 100? Count in 2’s up to 10. Can you go beyond this? Use a 100 square to help you <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learnin-g-to-count/paint-the-squares>
- Use Topmarks ‘Mental Maths Train’ which can be found via our Class Google Site. Select ‘+’ Addition then play ‘Up to 10 – One more than.’ Try the other games.
- Provide a selection of objects to sort in different ways. E.g. buttons can be sorted by colour, texture and material. Or use a variety of socks (clean ones!) to sort and a washing line to peg them on. Sort them by pattern, colour and size.
- **Nursery:** (Reception can also complete these tasks!) Counting by rote. Count forwards to 10 and then

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- Use the 'Tricky Word' songs on You Tube to reinforce sight recognition of Phase 2/3 words

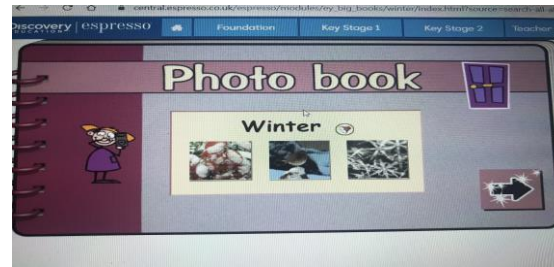
Phonic Nursery: (Reception can play them too!)

Game 1: 'Kim's Game' You will need a tray of up to 6 objects. Ask your child to find the object starting with an initial sound e.g. The -s-s-s sound (sock) You can also sound out the word. (s...o...ck) Identify all the objects by their initial sounds. Ask your child to look away as you remove an object. Can they remember which item has been taken away? Give them a clue... e.g. 'It starts with the letter 's'

Game 2: Add pairs of objects (real or pictures) that rhyme e.g. cat/hat, pen/ten, goat/boat. Find the rhyming pairs. Use the activity sheets in the Parent Resource File
